## **Establishing Capital Projects for 2018**

WHEREAS, the City of Craig Council annually prepares a comprehensive capital improvement program for the City of Craig; and,

WHEREAS, the United States Government and the State of Alaska annually prepare budgets and appropriate funds to local governments and state and federal agencies for the implementation of local and state capital improvement projects; and,

WHEREAS, the Craig City Council has identified certain capital improvement project priorities for the City of Craig for calendar year 2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following projects, set forth in order of priority, are established as the City of Craig's top priorities for capital improvement projects for calendar year 2018:
