Attached you will find Resolution 15-10. The resolution changes the rate for the sale of ice from the Craig public ice house.

When the rate schedule was adopted in 2004 it was geared to individual vessels and the last two years the majority of the ice purchases were from three businesses, Seafood Producers Cooperative, Silver Bay Seafoods and Noyes Island. With the large purchases the rate charged was \$55 per ton as per the resolution passed in May, 2004.

As the first table below shows the cost of producing ice rose to \$126 per ton for 2014. The 2014 table includes \$80,657 in maintenance costs that hopefully is a one-time expense. The second table projects the anticipated cost to produce ice at \$68 per ton. This cost does include the amortization of the large rebuild this year, currently totaling \$117,500, over ten years and an inflation adjustment to the other costs.

The harbor department and the budget committee are recommending the rate schedule be amended to have a flat rate of \$100 per ton with a 20% cash discount for business that purchase over 30 tons per month. If purchases continue similar to 2014 the majority of the ice will be sold at \$80 a ton.
