ORDINANCE NO. 373

ANNEXING THE PORT SAINT NICHOLAS ROAD AND FOUR ADJACENT, CITY OWNED PARCELS INTO THE CORPORATE BOUNDARY OF THE CITY OF CRAIG

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CRAIG, ALASKA:

Section 1. Classification. This is a non-code ordinance.


Section 2. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance and the application to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

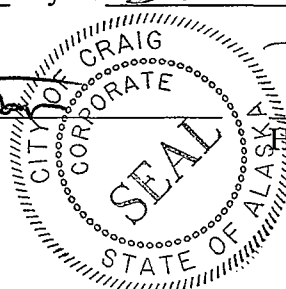
Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption.


Section 4. Action. This ordinance annexes the following city-owned properties into the city limits of the City of Craig, subject to the approval of the Local Boundary Commission pursuant to AS 29.06.040(b):

1. The Port Saint Nicholas Road, 9.15 mile long, 60 foot wide right-of-way which runs from the 1.5 mile mark of the Port Saint Nicholas Road (current City of Craig corporate boundary) to the City of Craig dam at North Fork Lake, crossing Sections 13 through 16, Township 74 South, Range 81 East Copper River Meridian, and Sections 8, 9, 10, 11, 17 and 18 Township 74 South, Range 82 East.
2. A 6.2 acre site within Section 13, Township 74 South, Range 81 East, known as Reconveyance Parcel No. 16, deeded to the City of Craig from Shaan-Seet, Inc. as part of the 1992 ANCSA 14(c)(3) settlement between the two parties.
3. Lot 2A of the Port Saint Nicholas Subdivision.
4. A 36 acre site within Section 17 Township 74 South, Range 82 East, known as Reconveyance Parcel No. 17, deeded to the City of Craig from Shaan-Seet, Inc. as part of the 1992 ANCSA 14(c)(3) settlement between the two parties.
5. A 2.8 acre site within Section 11, Township 74 South, Range 82 East, known as Reconveyance Parcel No. 18, deeded to the City of Craig from Shaan-Seet, Inc. as part of the 1992 ANCSA 14(c)(3) settlement between the two parties.
